A reminder to grade eleven and twelve students and their parents to check the Career Centre Website Calendar often for date-specific information and Like and Follow Ms. Millar's Career Centre Facebook Page to receive notifications. See Post-Secondary Websites for the latest information and updates. There are many online/in-person information sessions for grades 10-12 students and their parents. Grade twelve students: Post-Secondary Application Portals are Open! See the post-secondary websites for details and remember to watch for deadlines! Apply early to colleges and to universities by the deadlines. Apply early to out of province institutions. Most BC post-secondary institutions now use EducationPlannerBC (unless the post-secondary requires you to apply directly on their website e.g., BCIT). If so, you will be directed to make an EducationPlannerBC account, select the post-secondary you wish to apply to, complete the application, and pay the post-secondary application fee, to submit your application. Sign back in to EducationPlanner BC to add more institutions. *After you apply, check your post-secondary and email accounts often for communication, instructions, and deadlines! Contact the institution directly if you have any questions regarding your application.

If you plan on applying to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) at Douglas College, you will need to first apply to and complete the one-year Certificate in Academic Foundations for Potential Nursing Applicants. You will be required to take 10 university-transferable courses in the sciences and liberal arts that will prepare you for entrance into the BSN program. Once you've completed all required courses with a minimum grade of C+, you will receive priority registration for entrance to the BSN program. It is important to note that completion of this certificate does not guarantee admission to the BSN program. DEC 15/22 SFU Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarships - The SFU Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarship (USES) Program is open to both domestic and international high school applicants who demonstrate academic and community contributions. Applicants must have grades in the 90% range in [courses required for their selected program](#) or 31 IB points (excluding predicted bonus points). References – you will be asked provide contact information for two referees who have direct knowledge of information you provided in your application such as your academics, extra-curricular activities or personal achievements. The two people you list will be contacted directly via email by SFU once you submit your application. **Beedie School of Business & Sustainable Energy Engineering Applicants** - If your USES application meets the minimum requirements to be considered for USES, you are not required to submit the Supplemental Application for admission to your program. Your USES application will be reviewed in lieu of the Supplemental Application for admission to your program as well as the awarding of USES. Applicants who submit USES applications which do not meet the minimum requirements will be contacted and required to submit the Supplemental Application required for admission to their program at a later date. This includes paying the Supplemental Application fee required by the program, if applicable.
