See Post-Secondary Websites for the latest information and updates. There are many online/in-person information sessions for grades 10-12 students and their parents. Grade twelve students: Post -Secondary Application Portals are Open! See the post-secondary websites for details and watch for deadlines! Apply early to colleges and to universities by the deadlines. Apply early to out of province institutions. Most BC post-secondary institutions use [EducationPlannerBC](#) (unless the post-secondary requires you to apply directly on their website e.g., BCIT). If so, you will be directed to make an EducationPlannerBC account, select the post-secondary you wish to apply to, complete the application, and pay the post-secondary application fee to submit your application. Sign back in to add more institutions. *After you apply, check post-secondary and email accounts often for communication, instructions, and deadlines! Remember to complete the [BC Ministry of Education Student Transcript Services Form](#) and also self-report marks if required so the institutions can access your marks/graduation. Contact the institution directly if you have any questions regarding your application.

- B) Be planning to pursue post-secondary studies (academic, vocational, technical, or training).

FEB 28/23 Women's Cyber Security Scholarships Deadline

\$5,000 - 10 Awards To be eligible for the scholarship a student must:

- A) Be pursuing or planning to pursue a degree with a focus on cybersecurity or information assurance.
- B) Have a GPA of at least 3.3 on a 4.0 scale (or an analogous rank based on a comparable scale).

This annual \$500 scholarship is awarded to support a young musician in their musical development. This award may be used to pay for private lessons, choir fees, purchase of music or instruments, travel to a music program, participation in music festivals, post-secondary tuition or any other item relating to music education.

Eligibility:

the applicant identifies as a woman and is between the ages of 15 and 20 on the application deadline

the applicant has been involved in a school or community choral program

the applicant does not have to be pursuing a career in music

FEB 28/23 BCSTA's Scholarships for Student Citizenship 3:00 PM Deadline to Apply

Recognize graduating students for outstanding contributions they have made to their school and community. Three awards of \$750 each will be distributed. This scholarship recognizes graduating B.C. public school students who have displayed exemplary citizenship within their school and community.

Students must be graduating from a B.C. public school in the 2022/2023 school year.

Students must be planning to attend a post-secondary institution.

MAR 1/23 Dalhousie University Entrance Awards/Scholarship Deadline to Apply

Generally, students need an 80% admission average or 26 predicted/anticipated IB Diploma points to be considered.

Averages are calculated using the 5 courses that are required for the program that the student has applied for. Both

domestic and international students are eligible to apply. For First Nations Indigenous and Black Student

MAR 1/23 8:59 PM PST COPA Neil J. Armstrong Scholarship \$14,000 Deadline

Has financially supported the development of young pilots aged between 16 and 21. This longstanding scholarship was created in honour of Canadian Aviation Hall of Fame inductee Neil J. Armstrong. This award comes with a free one-year COPA Student membership. Applicants are assessed on their demonstrated interest in aviation, community involvement, academic achievements, ability to set and achieve goals, and commitment to completing flight training. A COPA membership is not necessary.

Eligibility Criteria for the AB-Initio Scholarship: Applicants must be between the ages of 16 and 21 as of the application deadline.

Applicants must be a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.

Applicants for the Ab-Initio Scholarship must not: at the time of application, been granted any pilot privileges including: Private Pilot's License, Recreational Pilot License, Ultra-Light Pilot Permit or Soaring / Glider License. (Applicants may be the holder of a student pilot permit), and have not completed more than 10 hours of flight training.

The review committee may consider candidates with more than 10 hours in certain circumstances, particularly where the training has occurred over an extended period.

Additionally, applicants who have been awarded other flight training scholarship(s), including flight training through the Canadian Air Cadet program or any other program are not eligible for the Ab-Initio Award. To apply go
