General Information About Graduation



What is graduation?

The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "Dogwood Diploma" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate.

French Immersion students can earn both a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique.

To graduate with both diplomas, French Immersion students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood Diploma and, of these **80 credits**, 28 of those must be in certain FI courses.

- Please be aware that French Immersion students will not complete their FI graduation requirements by completing Socials, Science, or Career Life Education courses during the summer, because the language of instruction is English.
- If you plan to register for summer school courses, please indicate this in the bottom right-hand box on your program planning sheet “Programming Notes” and then select the next level course on the main part of your sheet i.e. if you are planning to take math 10 over the summer you will select a math 11 course or another elective for next year.

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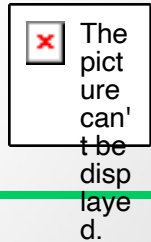
