If so, you will be directed to make an EducationPlannerBC account, select the post-secondary you wish to apply to, complete the application, and pay the post-secondary application fee to submit your application. Sign back in to add more institutions. *After you apply, check post-secondary and email accounts often for communication, instructions, and deadlines! Remember to complete the BC Ministry of Education Student Transcript Services Form /and also self-report marks if required so the institutions can access your marks/graduation. Contact the institution directly if you have any questions regarding your application.
