A reminder to grades eleven and twelve students and their parents to check the Career Centre Website Calendar often for date-specific information and Like and Follow Ms. Millar's Career Centre Facebook Page to receive notifications. See Post-Secondary Websites for the latest information and updates. There are many online/in-person information sessions for grades 10-12 students and their parents. Grade twelve students: Post-Secondary Application Portals are Open! See the post-secondary websites for details and watch for deadlines! Apply early to colleges and to universities by the deadlines. Most BC institutions use [EducationPlannerBC](#) (unless the post-secondary requires you to apply directly on their website e.g., BCIT). If so, you will be directed to make an EducationPlannerBC account, select the post-secondary you wish to apply to, complete the application, and pay the post-secondary application fee to submit your application. Sign back in to add more institutions. *After you apply, check post-secondary and email accounts often for communication, instructions, and deadlines! Remember to complete the [BC Ministry of Education Student Transcript Services Form](#) and also self-report marks if required, so the institutions can access your marks/graduation. Contact the institution directly if you have any questions regarding your application.

- Participated in a BCSS activity.

Scholarship Amounts Two (2) \$750 scholarships will be awarded to one male and one female.

MAY 1/23 Dave Gifford Memorial & BCSS Zone Scholarship Deadline *only one application

Only one application needed for consideration for both awards. To qualify for one of the BCSS Scholarships, the applicant must:

Be enrolled in and participated in a minimum of one BCSS Sanctioned Sport at a BCSS Member School during their grade 12 year for the Zone scholarship and participated in at least two sanctioned BCSS sports during their grade 12 year to be considered for the Dave Gifford Memorial Scholarship

Be graduating this year and will be entering their first year of full-time studies at an "Accredited Post-Secondary Institution"

Have demonstrated exceptional athletic achievement in a BCSS activity and, have a min grade percentage of 75%

Have demonstrated outstanding service and leadership in school and/or community

Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or person to whom refugee protection has been confirmed under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

Gifford Memorial Scholarships Dave Gifford was a BCSS Director from 1988-90 and received the BCSS Honour Award in 1992. He was a teacher and Administrator in Vancouver and died in 1992. In his honour, the Dave Gifford Memorial Scholarship was created.

Two (2) \$1500 scholarships will be awarded to the top male and female from across the province BCSS Zone Scholarships

Two (2) \$750 scholarships will be awarded for each BCSS athletic zone to one male and one female

MAY 2/23 Got a Spine Scholarship Deadline to Apply

MAY 5/23 The FCSSBC Youth Education Bursary Deadline

The bursary is available to a maximum of \$2,000 per academic year (two semesters).

Eligibility: You are currently in care or you are a former youth in care in the province of BC. This includes being under a continuing custody order (CCO), temporary custody order (TCO, Voluntary Agreement or Special Needs Agreement), or a Youth Agreement under British Columbia's Child, Family and Community Services Act.

You are a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident.

You are 30 years old or younger in the year of your application.

You are currently attending or plan on enrolling into a post-secondary academic program in a recognized Canadian public post-secondary institution. If you are unsure whether your school is a recognized Canadian public institution, consult the [list of Public Institutions on the BC Ministry of Advanced Education website](#).

Your education plans relate to a career in the field of Human and Social Services. Examples include Social Work, Counselling, Child & Youth Care, Psychology, Community, Family & Child Studies, Gerontology & Social Work, Mental Health & Addictions, Pre-Social Work. You can still apply for the bursary if you are receiving other bursaries and/or a tuition waiver. Bursary funds are given directly to the academic institution for deposit into the student's account. Bursary funds must be used within 18 months (for recipients in 2023, funds must be used by the January semester of 2025). You can apply for the bursary more than once. This means you can be awarded the bursary multiple years in a row. All applicants will be notified about the status of their applications by early June 2023.
