Sign back in to add more institutions. After you apply, check post-secondary/email accounts often for communication, instructions, and deadlines! Remember to complete the BC Ministry of Education Student Transcript Services Form and also self-report marks if required so the institutions can access your marks/graduation. Contact the institution directly if you have any questions regarding your application.

The program or course must promote your career development. The financial assistance is for anticipated expenses associated with your participation in the program or course.
