

What is graduation? The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "Dogwood Diploma" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate.

French Immersion students can earn both a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique.

To graduate with both diplomas, French Immersion students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood Diploma and, of these **credits**, 28 of those must be in certain FI courses.

Specific Things to consider for G12s... ≻ Career Preparation/Work Experience Course

Career Prep 12 (Health Sciences, Physical and Health Education, Art, Human Services, Theatre), is a 4 credit asynchronous course (running outside the timetable) that allows you to volunteer in a placement in the field of your choosing (in consultation with your supervising teacher). In the past, for CP Health Sciences 12, we have had students volunteer in areas such as physiotherapy, pharmacy, optometry, veterinary medicine, and many more.





Specific Things to consider for G12s...

➢ Study Blocks: often G12s may elect to take one study block. Please keep in mind that in order to be considered a full-time student at McRoberts, you are only permitted to have two non-enrolling classes in your schedule. Students who are not full time are not eligible for school-based scholarships.







G12 Course Selection Summary

- Select a course load that is manageable and ensures graduation.
- > Do your research and if in doubt ask and seek help.
- Start as early as possible, as good choices often come from extensive research.
- Select a course load that will keep as many of your post-secondary options as open as possible.
- ➢ Ensure you have selected at least six enrolling classes to maintain eligibility for scholarship consideration in your G12 year.
- Review and consider your extra-curricular commitments job, clubs, teams, etc.
- Factor in Grade 12 responsibilities Capstone / CLC, applications for admissions, scholarships etc.





OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- ➢ Fine Arts or Applied Skills Course
 - Students must complete 4 credits in either Fine Arts or Applied Skills in either Grade 10, 11, or 12.
- Second Language Course
 - Not needed for graduation
 - Is an entrance requirement for some post secondary options
- ≻Elective Courses Overall
 - Select courses for interest, ability
 - Research and investigate by reading the Program Planning Guide on the McRoberts website by following: students>program planning> Grade 8 –11 Program Planning The order you place them on your sheets indicates level of preference.
- Peer Helping and Yearbook require completed application forms which can be found in the counselling centre.





> Full Credit Summer School Considerations

- Students can choose to attempt up to 2 full academic courses (worth 4 credits each) over the summer.
- Please consult the Richmond Virtual School (rvs.sd38.bc.ca) or Richmond Continuing Education (www.RichmondCE.ca) websites for more information about available courses. RVS registration opens February 20, 2024. RCE is TBA.
- Please be aware that French Immersion students will not complete their FI graduation requirements by completing Socials, Science, or Career Life Education courses during the summer, because the language of instruction is English.
- If you plan to register for summer school courses please indicate this in the bottom right hand box on your program planning sheet "Programming Notes" and then select the next level course on the main part of your sheet i.e. if you are planning to take math 10 over the summer you will select a math 11 course or another elective for next year.
- International students must get permission from their counsellor prior to registering. Extra fees are required.


➢ Post secondary options: this is often one of the biggest considerations for senior students and requires significant research, planning and a growing awareness of available options enhanced by your participation and learning in your Career Life Education course.

"WORKING BACKWARDS"



Please keep in mind it's helpful when selecting courses for G12 to employ the concept of "working backwards" - for example investigating a number of potential career choices, in order to identify the post-secondary options required to pursue those careers, in order to identify the G12 courses needed to meet the admission requirements for those postsecondary programs.





<u>Important questions related to post-secondary</u> <u>planning:</u>

- What are my strengths & weaknesses, likes & dislikes?
- How do I build awareness of career and post-secondary opportunities?
- What post-secondary programs will allow me to pursue my potential career(s) of choice?
- What are the post-secondary pre-requisites? (grade 11 & 12 courses) examples: do I need a 2nd language? what math level do I need? which science(s) do I need? how many academic grade 12 courses are required? do I need to incorporate full credit summer school into my plan?
- What if I don't know where to start? How do I cover my bases to ensure I don't eliminate future opportunities?

<u>1 - MyBlueprint</u>

MyBlueprint is an online education and career planning platform that is available to all grade 8- 12 Richmond School District students. The purpose of MyBlueprint is to support students in thinking and planning for their futures to help guide them to increased success in schools.

Students can take **learning style**, **personality**, **interest**, **knowledge and motivation assessments** to learn more about themselves as well as to guide them to different career and education opportunities.

Students can plan their high school courses and investigate post-secondary career, job and volunteer opportunities. They also can create/plan budgets, build career portfolios and resumes.

Students have a username and password which allows them to log on to MyBlueprint. If you do not have a MyBlueprint account, please refer to instructions about how to open one on the program planning page on the McRoberts website: **Students>Program Planning>G9-11 Program Planning**. All grade 10-12 students are encouraged to access MyBlueprint in order to assist with their future program planning decisions. If they have trouble logging on, they should consult with Mr. Malchy.





<u>2 – Career and Post-Secondary Advisor – Ms. E. Tang</u>

A majority of your research will be spent exploring post-secondary institutions online.

- Find out where you can pursue further studies/training in your chosen area.
 (University? College? Private Institute? Local? Provincial? National? International?)

- Consider <u>more than 1</u> institution. Go to each institution's website for the most up-to-date information.
- Admission requirements are institution-specific. (i.e. Admission to UBC Science is different from SFU Science – see above).
- ➢ Check admission requirements for the institution <u>AND</u> the program of study.



- Submit your course selection online in your MyEd account (closes March 1st 2024).
