GRAD ASSESSMENTS

The Ministry of Education requires students to successfully complete three graduation assessments between grade 10 and grade 12: A Numeracy Assessment and two Literacy assessments, one in Grade 10 and a second in

The Ministry of Education requires students to successfully complete three graduation assessments between grade 10 and grade 12: A Numeracy Assessment and two Literacy assessments, one in Grade 10 and a second in Grade 12. Our French Immersion students also need to complete a written and oral assessment in their Grade 12 year. The graduation assessments are not tied to specific courses or grade levels nor do students earn 'credits' toward graduation by completing the assessments. They are, however, required components of the Graduation Program.

Our Grade 10 students will be writing the Grad Numeracy Assessment (GNA) on January 15 & 16. Our Grade 12 French Immersion students will be taking their LTF on January 15th. More information will be provided to students, including their scheduled writing date and time via email.

NUMERACY / LITERACY

This year, the Richmond School District is supporting a Literacy/Numeracy Mentorship position at every secondary school. Mme. Mainville is our Literacy/Numeracy leader and has been hard at work determining how best to support literacy and numeracy with our students. Based on the data collected from students and staff, we have two main school goals. For literacy, we are working on the following questions: How do we create opportunities for students to grow their comprehension skills in order to read/understand more complex texts? How do we build resiliency to get there? Our numeracy goal is based on the question: How do we create more confidence in staff including numeracy development in their subject area?
