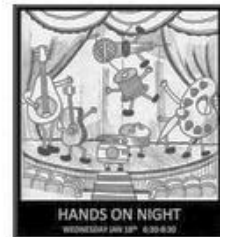

Being aware of information and having a plan is the key to having a successful year and a smoother transition out of secondary school.**

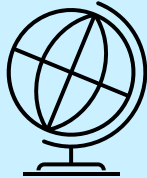

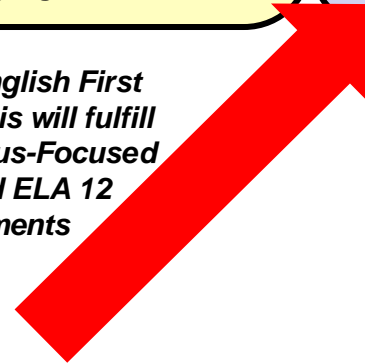

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French Immersion Dual Dogwood

G12 Course Selection Summary

1. Select a course load that is manageable and ensures graduation.
2. Do your research and if in doubt seek help.
3. Start as early as possible, as good choices often come from extensive research.
4. Select a course load that will keep as many of your post-secondary options as open as possible.
5. Ensure you have selected at least six enrolling classes to maintain eligibility for scholarship consideration in your G12 year.
6. Review and consider your extra-curricular commitments (job, clubs, teams, etc).
7. Factor in Grade 12 responsibilities – Capstone / CLC, applications for post secondary, scholarships etc.



Summer School Considerations



Full Credit Summer School Considerations

- ⑩ Students can choose to take up to 2 full academic courses (worth 4 credits each) over the summer.
- ⑩ Please consult [Richmond Virtual School](#) (RVS) or [Richmond Continuing Education](#) (RCE) for more information.
- ⑩ RVS registration opens February 18, 2025. RCE is TBA.
- ⑩ Please be aware that French Immersion (FI) students will **not** complete their FI graduation requirements by completing Socials, Science, or Career Life Education courses during the summer, because the language of instruction is English.
- ⑩ If you plan to register for summer school courses indicate which course you will be taking in the bottom right hand box on your program planning form.
- ⑩ International students must get permission from their counsellor and Mr. Cook prior to registering. Extra fees are required.

Grade 12 Course Considerations



Specific Things to consider for G12s...

➤ Career Preparation/Work Experience Course

Available Offerings:

1. Health Sciences
2. Physical and Health Education,
3. Art
4. Human Services
5. Theatre

This is a 4-credit asynchronous course (running outside the timetable) that allows you to volunteer in a placement in the field of your choosing in consultation with your supervising teacher.

Students are required to obtain 100 hours of work experience to meet course requirements.

Example: A placement in CP Health Sciences 12 could include volunteering at a pharmacy, optometry, veterinary medicine, or physiotherapy clinic etc.





Grade 12 Course Considerations



Study & Non-enrolling blocks

If meeting graduation requirements, Grade 12's may elect to take **one** study block.

In order to be considered a full-time student at McRoberts, you are permitted to have one none-enrolling classes in your schedule in addition to a study block.

Students must have a minimum of 6 enrolling classes to be eligible for school-based scholarships.






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Important questions related to post-secondary planning:

- What are my strengths & weaknesses, likes & dislikes?
- How do I build awareness of career and post-secondary opportunities?
- What post-secondary programs will allow me to pursue my potential career(s) of choice?
- What are the post-secondary pre-requisites? (grade 11 & 12 courses)
examples: do I need a 2nd language? what math level do I need? which science(s) do I need? how many academic grade 12 courses are required? do I need to incorporate full credit summer school into my plan?
- What if I don't know where to start? How do I cover my bases to ensure I don't eliminate future opportunities?
- Here's where we can direct you towards 3 main school-based resources.

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4 – Consultation with Post Secondaries Directly

A majority of your research will be spent exploring post-secondary institutions online.

- Find out where you can pursue further studies/training in your chosen area. (*University? College? Private Institute? Local? Provincial? National? International?*)
 - myBlueprint.ca/sd38
 - Educationplannerbc.ca
- Consider more than 1 institution. Go to each institution's website for the most up-to-date information.
- Admission requirements are institution-specific. (*i.e. Admission to UBC Science is different from SFU Science – see above*).
- Check admission requirements for the institution AND the program of study.



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-
- College and University Applications
 - Admission requirements for colleges and universities can vary greatly, and admission into university is often far more competitive.
 - Therefore, if you are sure you want to go to university it is also worth considering applying to a college too. Many of our students apply to at least one college (sometimes with a plan to transfer to university later), alongside their university application/s, which we strongly encourage all students to do, as there is no such thing as guaranteed admission anywhere.
 - For those who know they would like to go on to study at college we strongly recommend applying early (and places are given on a 'first-come-first-served' basis) to more than one institution in case places fill up quickly.

If you decide to apply to institutions in the US:

1. Let your counsellor know ASAP
2. Check out SAT exams for U.S. Post secondary institutes and were recommend that you book a registration date ASAP

4. Check to see if you need references and begin to approach possible referees as they will need time to write a good letter.

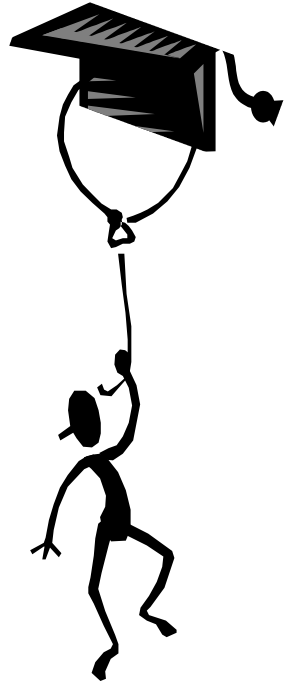
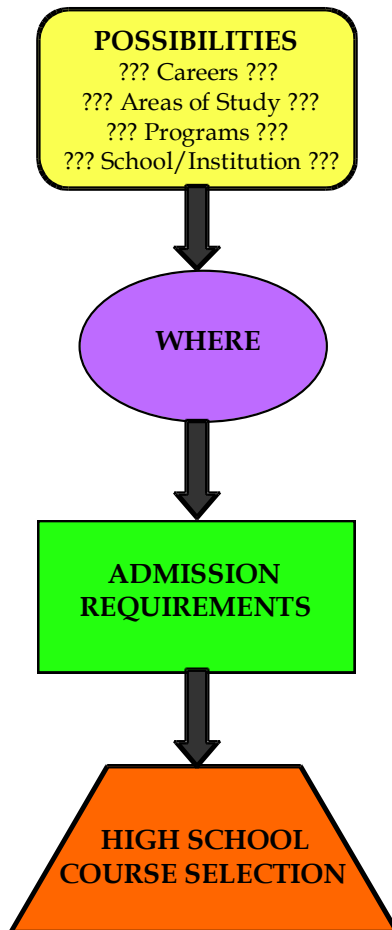




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"WORKING BACKWARDS"

- Select a course load that will keep as many of your post-secondary options as open as possible.
- Ensure you have selected at least six enrolling classes to maintain eligibility for scholarship consideration in your G12 year.
- Review and consider your extra-curricular commitments - job, clubs, teams, etc.
- Factor in Grade 12 responsibilities – Capstone / CLC, applications for admissions, scholarships etc.
