How do I apply outside of BC?








Post-secondary options are now so numerous and varied, that while we can provide general guidance, we strongly encourage you to **research with your child.**





1. myBlueprint

- Gr. 12 students can sometimes feel overwhelmed by choice when beginning post-secondary planning. However, often they already know more than they think, as through their Career Life Education (CLE) course they have already begun the process.
- In CLE students have already learned how to use myBlueprint to explore the learning styles, personality, interests, knowledge and motivations. Through using MyBlueprint, students can begin to research colleges and university programs, as well as find the prerequisite courses required to apply.

3. Application Process in BC

3. Application Process in BC

Step I

- Go to the website of each institution and program that you are applying to.
- Check the most up to date information on admission requirements not only for the institution <u>but ALSO</u> for the program of study.
 (i.e. General Requirements vs Program Requirements)

Step 2

 Be prepared to complete your application for postsecondary in B.C., through the educationplannerBC website In order to do this, you will need:

- i. Provincial Education
 Number (PEN#)(9-digits)
 ii. to report any
 completed Gr. II/I2 final
 grades (from your report
 card).
- iii. Credit or debit card to pay application fees (save the application confirmation number and the fee confirmation).

3. Application Process in BC

Step III To-Do Checklist

- Pay the application fee online with a credit/debit card.
- O Submit your application and save the page with your application ID number so that you can track the progress of your application and make inquiries.
- O By letter or e-mail, you will receive your **permanent university or college ID** number that is used to access your status, pay tuition and choose courses. *Don't lose this number!*
- Note: Your application will not be fully processed without your PEN or payment.

4. Ontario Applications

The application to the Ontario Post-Secondary Institutes is available www.ouac.on.ca - (It is the IO5 form)

At this time, the OUAC application fee is \$156 for 3 institutional choices, and \$50 for each thereafter. Generally, you can only apply to a maximum of 3 programs at each university (although some universities may have further limits). There may be other fees required by the individual universities during the application stage.

Therefore, do your research and know where you want to go.

International students – who are neither a permanent resident or Canadian citizen pay a further fee of \$10.

Note: early admission deadlines vary by institution.

Note: Attend the Canadian Universities Event & meet many Canadian University Representatives.

Note: Check the career centre website for updates and more details.

6. USA Applications

American colleges/universities mostly use the common application site: www.commonapp.org

If you decide to apply to institutions in the US:

- I. Let your counsellor know ASAP
- 2. Check out SAT exams for U.S. Post secondary institutes and were recommend that you book a registration date ASAP www.collegeboard.com
- 3. McRoberts SAT registration # is 821311.
- 4. Check to see if you need references and begin to approach possible referees as they will need time to write a good letter.

7. Transcripts

For most institutions in BC students will share their transcript with the places you've applied to via the Student Transcript Service (STS). It provides electronic transmission of marks to the post-secondary institutions of your choice: www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca

How do I use STS?

- I. Access the website
- 2. Register for a basic BCeID account. You will need your PEN.
- 3. Record your ID, password and the 3 password reset questions for future reference.
- 4. Once you set up this account, you can continue to the student transcript site, log in and order/send your transcripts to all the Post-Secondaries that you have applied to.

7. Transcripts

www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca (STS)

After you have ordered / sent transcripts these post-secondary institutions will be able to "pull" your transcript whenever they want to see it. You will *not* be required to set this up again.

Register early to ensure that the post-secondary institutions you've applied to, can access your mid-year and final marks in time.

Note: If you need an official paper transcript, please fill in the blue form in the front office and hand it in to, Ms. Brodie, the office administrator.

8. Scholarships

BC Excellence Scholarship - \$5,000 (55 awarded) Each school will nominate one student. See Mr. K. Li for details. www.bced.gov.bc.ca/awards

BC Achievement Scholarship - \$1,250 (3,000 awarded) Based on grade 10, 11 & 12 including elective courses. Apply through McRoberts School Scholarship -Online in March/April 2025. www.bced.gov.bc.ca/awards

Pathway to Teacher's Education Scholarship - \$5,000 (20 awarded). Must apply by mid-Feb, 2025. Application available at: www.bced.gov.bc.ca/awards

McRoberts School Scholarship Program. These Scholarships are given to McRoberts Students only. Many different criteria are considered, so ALL grade 12 students are encouraged to fill in this application. There are 30+ different scholarships.

Applications will be online and available to students in March/April.

8. Scholarships

Where else to look? Community/Business/Athletic/etc. Associations to which you or your family belong, Parent/Your Workplace, and the post-secondary institutions to which you are applying. As well as www.studentawards.com.


Please **see Mr. K. Li (Vice-Principal)** for details regarding the scholarships that require the **school's nomination**.

Some scholarships may need a **letter of recommendation**. Please see a teacher, counsellor, administrator, coach or employer etc. for this.
