

Literacy/Numeracy Tidbits for the Classroom

Did you know...

Did you know that **large-print** books can significantly enhance reading for striving readers?

Dr. Julie Evans of the non profit **Project Tomorrow**, explores in her 2023-2024 study of 1700 students from grades 3-12, the benefits of large-print books and highlights research showing that these books can **improve fluency**, comprehension, and confidence. For example, the study notes that larger text increases focus and reduces eye fatigue, enabling readers to concentrate longer. Additionally, it emphasizes that large print supports improved decoding and word recognition, especially for readers with learning differences.

Important details...

Large print in the study = **16 pt font**Line spacing = **1.5**

Consider trying...

- Printing worksheets and tests in a larger font; put less information on one page; space things out; use larger pieces of paper (legal, tabloid).
- **Print stories** in larger print (especially for striving/reluctant/emerging readers)
- Choose large print novels (see library for information on publishers and availability)
- Use digital databases for information text that can be manipulated to change the size of the text (see library if you have questions)
