

Literacy/Numeracy Tidbits for the Classroom


Did you know...

The 2020 National Literacy Trust report, "Audiobooks and Literacy: A Rapid Review of the Literature" by Emily Best, examines the benefits of **audiobooks** in supporting children's literacy both at home and in the classroom.

Key findings from the review include:

- Reading Skills Enhancement:
 Audiobooks can aid in developing
 reading skills such as decoding and
 comprehension.
- Reading Enjoyment: Engagement with audiobooks has been linked to increased enjoyment of reading among children and young people.
- Emotional and Social Benefits:
 Audiobooks can support emotional intelligence and wellbeing by exposing listeners to diverse perspectives and experiences.
- Accessibility and Inclusion:
 Audiobooks provide access to
 literature for children who may
 struggle with traditional reading
 formats, thereby promoting inclusivity.
- Reading While Listening (RWL): The practice of reading along with audiobooks can reinforce word recognition and pronunciation skills.
