

- ✓ Prepared presentation for staff, PAC and district Literacy Team








What is a Performance Based Assessment?

A Performance-Based Assessment (PBA) is a type of evaluation where students demonstrate what they know and can do by applying skills, knowledge, and reasoning to real-world tasks or complex problems—rather than just recalling facts on a test. (Ex: reading a text for information and showing reading comprehension strategies)


Its purpose is to *provide teachers with formative feedback that will guide their practice*. It is a snapshot of a student's performance in a specific moment in time.




FALL 2025 PBA OVERALL SCORES

- 211 grade 8's
- 93 French Immersion students
- 31 ELL students
- 19 students with 1701 designations
- 6 students were absent
- 1 did not answer any questions


Distribution of 'Overall PBA Score' ENGLISH




Distribution of 'Overall PBA Score' FI



Distribution of 'Overall PBA Score' ELL




Distribution of 'Overall PBA Score' SPED



PRIORITY POPULATIONS

- Last year, over 48% of grade 8's were
 "EMERGING" in their word skills.
- This year, only 20%
 scored "EMERGING"
- 37 students scored
 "PROFICIENT EXTENDING" *almost
 20%!


Distribution of 'Word Skills'





What did we notice?

- We were impressed with their WORD SKILLS.
- Students struggled to summarize and identify main idea and details
- Some students were quite insightful at assessing reliability
- Written response was either GREAT or HORRIBLE... lots of lists and disorganized, random ideas
- We think the PBA prep activity helped activate prior knowledge as students were able to write about relationships and mental health thoughtfully (less about intergenerational relationships)
- Students did not always read the questions carefully and therefore did not respond correctly to the task.



What's next?

- ✓ Share data with grade 8 teachers
- ✓ Cross check data with upcoming interim reports (see if anyone is falling through the cracks)
- ✓ Continue working on WORD SKILLS but focus more SUMMARIZING AND IDENTIFIYING MAIN IDEA AND DETAILS.
- ✓ Continue to **support teachers** with pedagogy through Bitesized and individual/group collaborations
- ✓ **Report out results** and next steps to PAC, District Literacy Team and District Education Committee
- ✓ Collaboration with Sarah on ELL 1 and 2 and other collaborations
- ✓ Some kind of intervention with EMERGING STUDENTS
- ✓ Mid-point check in February → FI STUDENT PBA in French (sample)
