# GRADUATION

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The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "**Dogwood Diploma**" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

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Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate. Specific requirements at each of the grade 10-12 levels.

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French Immersion (FI) students can earn a dual Diploma.  
*(Dogwood Diploma + Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique).*

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To graduate with a dual diploma, FI students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood and 28 of 80 credits of must be in certain FI courses.

# GRADE 12 - Off-Timetable courses

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## CAREER PREP / WORK EXPERIENCE COURSES

Available Offerings:

1. Health Sciences
2. Physical and Health Education,
3. Art
4. Human Services
5. Theatre

### **Off-timetable course** (full year)

- allows you to volunteer in a placement in the field of your choosing in consultation with your supervising teacher.

*For example:* A placement in CP Health Sciences 12 could include volunteering at a pharmacy, optometry, veterinary medicine, or physiotherapy clinic etc.

- Students are required to obtain **100 hours of work experience** to meet course requirements.

# GRADE 12 - STUDY & NON-ENROLLING BLOCKS

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- If meeting graduation requirements, Grade 12's may elect to take **one** study block.
- To be considered a full-time student at McRoberts, you are permitted to have one non-enrolling class **and** one study block.
- Students must have a **minimum of 7 classes** at McRoberts to be eligible for school-based scholarships and Honour Roll.



# Cross Grade (10-12) Considerations

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## Full Credit Summer School Considerations

- Students can choose to take up to 2 full academic courses (worth 4 credits each) over the summer.
- Please consult **Richmond Virtual School** (RVS) or **Richmond Continuing Education** (RCE) for more information.
- Please be aware that French Immersion (FI) students **will not** complete their FI graduation requirements by completing Socials, Science, or Career Life Education courses during the summer, because the language of instruction is English.
- If you plan to register for summer school courses indicate which course you will be taking in the bottom righthand box on your program planning form.
- International students must get permission from their counsellor and Mr. Cook prior to registering. Extra fees are required.

### **In the first 2 weeks of September we change courses for:**

- Summer school completion
- Failed courses
- Courses already taken and passed

## **Deadlines**

- Changes stop after **Week 2** of school
- Courses cannot be dropped after **September** because your seat is funded and paid for.
- Preference-based changes are not possible
- Support focuses on **coping, advocacy, and success**, not schedule changes

<p>In order to meet graduation requirements and be awarded a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), students must earn a minimum of 80 credits and write all provincial assessments of numeracy and literacy. The 80 credits must include 52 credits for required courses and a minimum of 28 elective credits. The 28 elective credits may be from Ministry-Authorized or <a href="#">Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses</a>, post-secondary courses or <a href="#">external credentials</a>, but not Locally Developed courses. Students must also complete a minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections. At least 4 credits must have an Indigenous focus. **Note:** Failure to **POST** your course selections will impact the course registration totals and may cause a course to be dropped due to lack of enrollment. Each time you make a change after posting, you must hit post again for the system to pick up the changes.

- **PLEASE NOTE:** you can go back into this account at any time during the course selection timeline to make changes and re-post your selection.
- Course selection window **closes on Wednesday, February 25 @ 9am.**
- Please make sure that your selections in MyEd **match** the courses you selected on your Course Selection Sheet!
- If you make any changes in MyEd, make sure you also make those same changes on your paper form.
- **Suggestion:** Take a photo of your Program Planning Form prior to handing it in.
