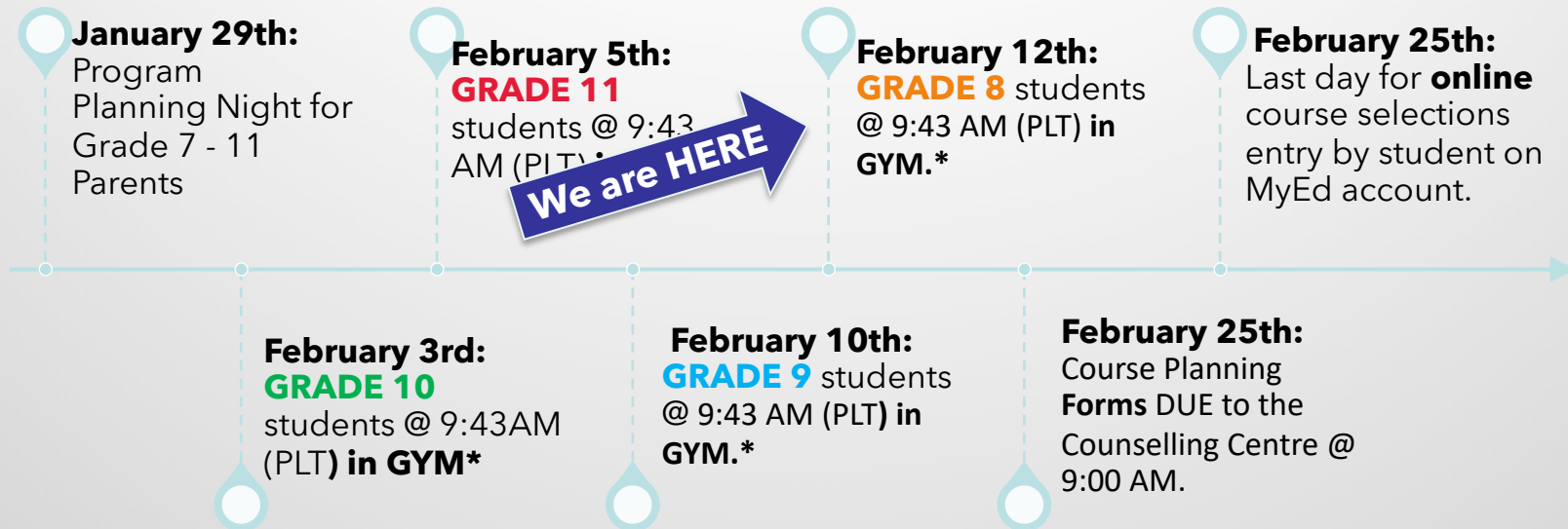

Choose with care

- High school courses are **year-long commitments**

Course changes

- After the **end of week 2**, we will **not** change timetables.
- Courses cannot be dropped after **September** because your course is fully funded and paid for.

If class feels hard, **support is available.**



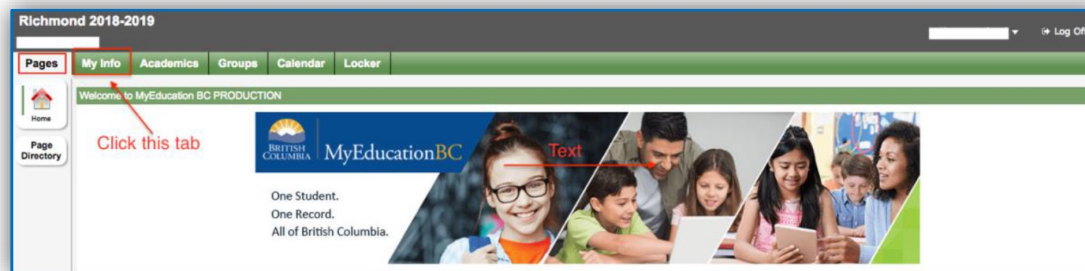

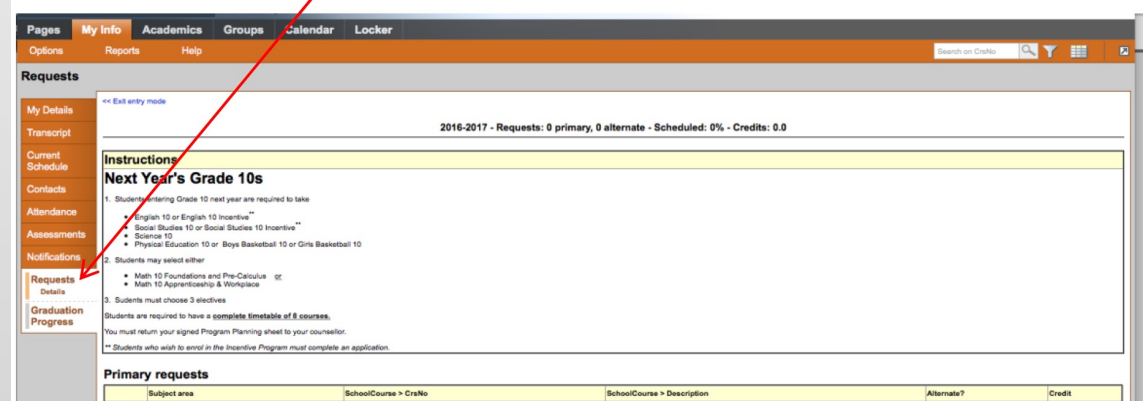
