Grade 9 students are required to take 1 Fine Art and 1 Applied Skill elective.

A language can be substituted for one of these.

ELECTIVE COURSES – OPTIONS

- **FINE ARTS:** studio art, ceramics & sculpture, drawing & painting, yearbook and media arts, concert band, guitar, jazz band, choir, drama
- **APPLIED SKILLS:** entrepreneurship & marketing 10, info & communication technology, foods, textiles, drafting, electronics, metalwork, woodwork, youth explores trades skills
- **OTHER:** Second Languages: Spanish L1, Japanese L1, French 9

No prerequisites are required for most of these.

The one exception is French 9 which requires students to have French 8.

Why Course Choices Matter

Choose with care

- High school courses are **year-long commitments**
- It's normal to feel unsure at first

Course changes

- A short change window exists **only in the first 2 weeks of September**
- Changes made are for educational reasons only

Deadlines

- After the **end of week 2**, we will **not** change timetables.
- Courses cannot be dropped after **September** because your course is fully funded and paid for.

If class feels hard, **support is available.**

High school is about learning to **stick with challenges**, not avoiding them.

Think carefully, choose thoughtfully, and ask questions early.





Note: Failure to **POST** your course selections will impact the course registration totals and may cause a course to be dropped due to lack of enrollment. Each time you make a change after posting, you must hit post again for the system to pick up the changes.

- Please note that you **can go back into this account** at any time during the Course Selection timeline to make changes and re-post your selection.
- Course selection window **closes on Friday, February 27 @ 9am.**
- Please make sure that your selections in MyEd **match** the courses you selected on your Course Selection Sheet!
