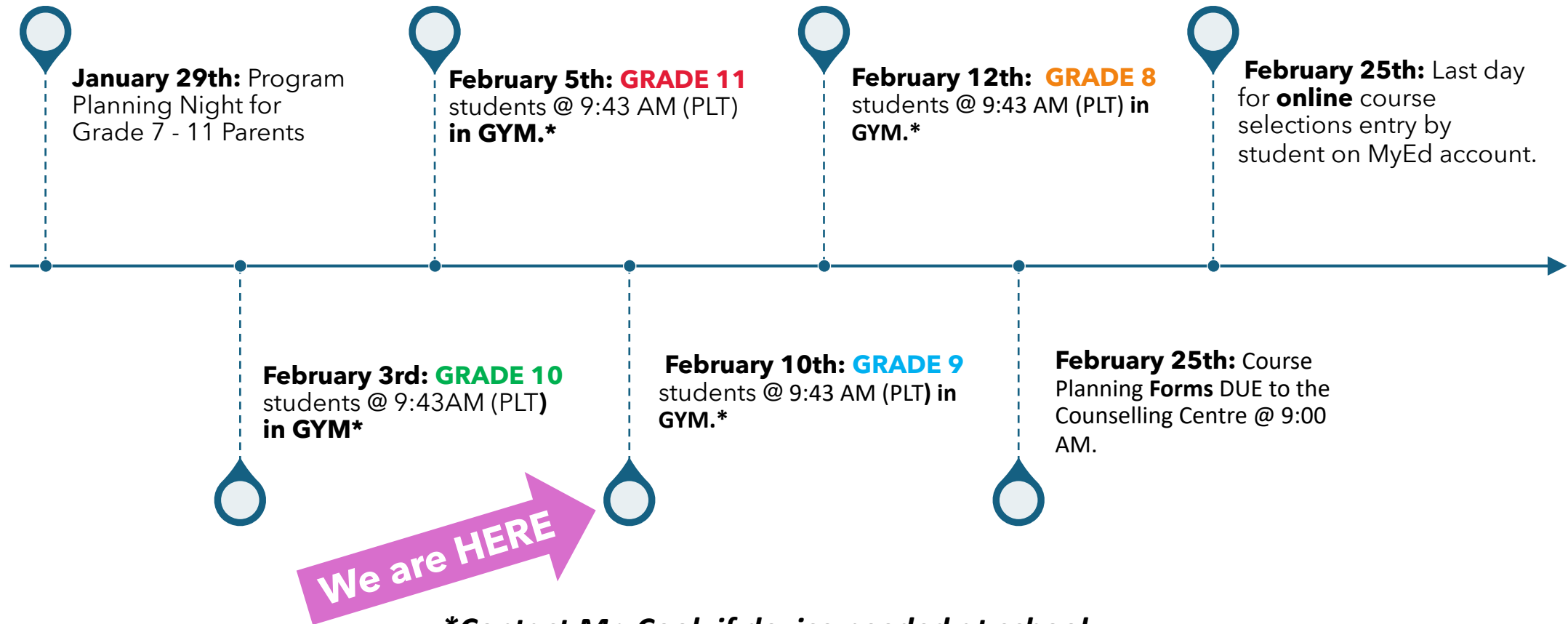

GRADUATION

The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "**Dogwood Diploma**" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate. Specific requirements at each of the grade 10-12 levels.

French Immersion (FI) students can earn a dual Diploma.
(Dogwood Diploma + Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique).

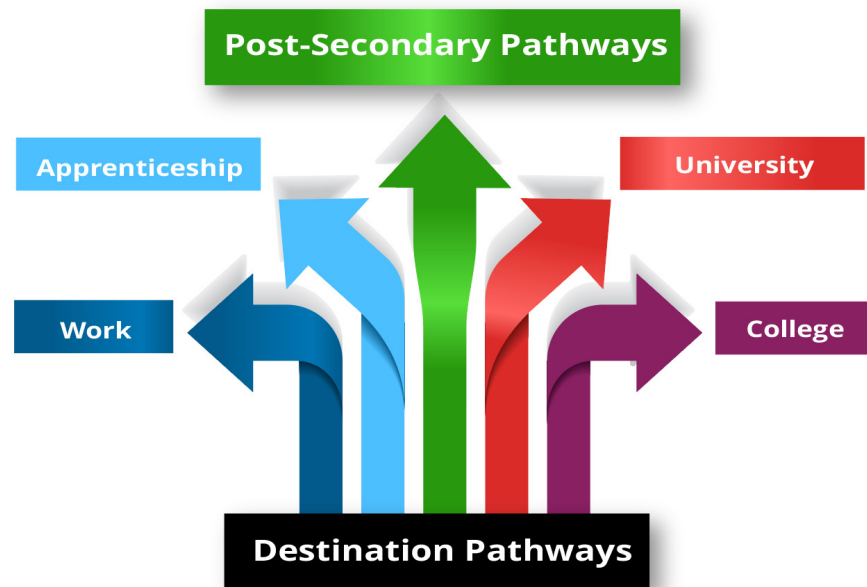
To graduate with a dual diploma, FI students must meet the graduation requirements for the Dogwood and 28 of 80 credits of must be in certain FI courses.

CLE 10 - Planning for After Graduation

ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (FI)

- International students must get permission from their counsellor **and** Mr. Cook prior to registering. Extra fees are required.

- Failed courses
- Courses already taken and passed


Deadlines

- Changes stop after **Week 2** of school
- Courses cannot be dropped after **September** because your seat is funded and paid for.

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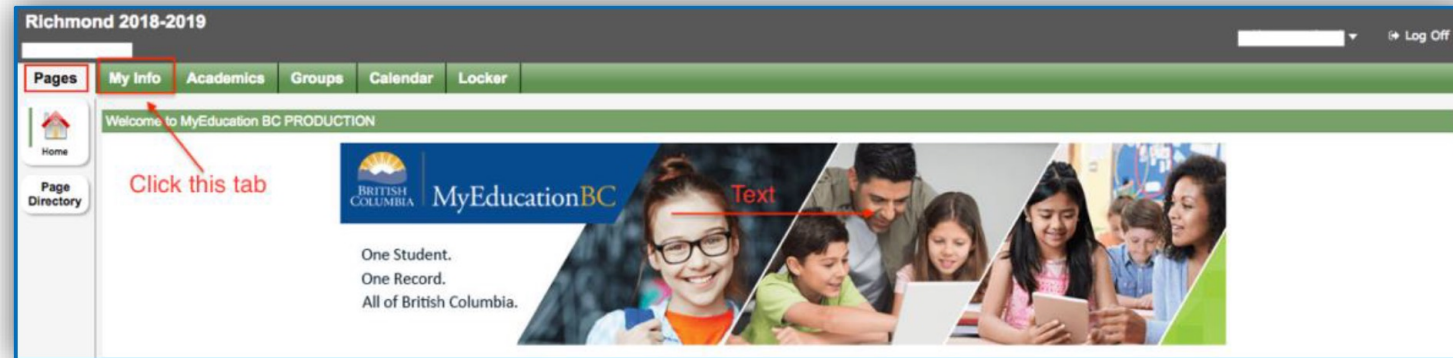

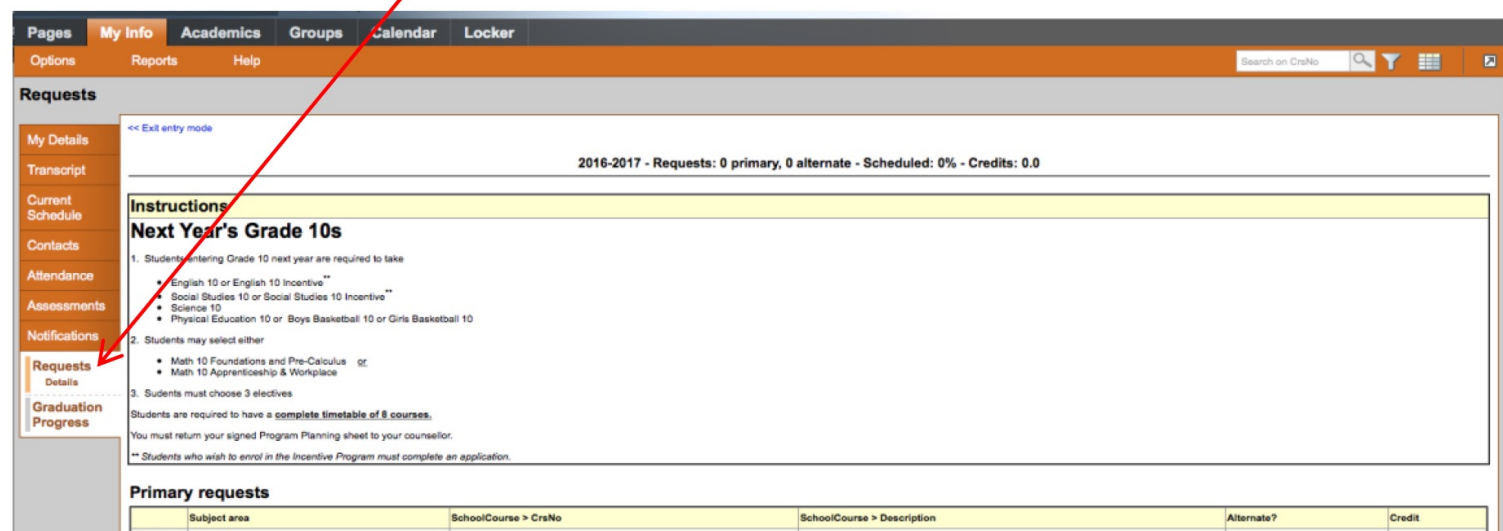

Selecting Courses in MyEducation BC

IMPORTANT! When all of your course selections are correct hit the **POST** button on the bottom of the window.

Note: Failure to **POST** your course selections will impact the course registration totals and may cause a course to be dropped due to lack of enrollment. Each time you make a change after posting, you must hit post again for the system to pick up the changes.

- Please note that you **can go back into this account** at any time during the Course Selection timeline to make changes and re-post your selection.
- Course selection window **closes on Wednesday, February 25 @ 9am.**
- Please make sure that your selections in MyEd **match** the courses you selected on your Course Selection Sheet!
- If you make any changes in MyEd, make sure you also make those same changes on your paper form.
- **Suggestion:** Take a photo of your Program Planning Form prior to handing it in.
